#### Your councils are changing

Major changes are planned to councils across Worcestershire as part of the biggest shake-up of local government in more than 50 years.

The Government is requiring 21 areas of England to restructure their system of local government before 2029.

There are two parts to the Government's proposed changes:

### Local government reorganisation

Where the Government is looking to replace borough/ district/city and county councils with fewer councils.

#### **Devolution**

Where the Government is looking to transfer powers and funding to new Strategic Authorities (also called Combined Authorities) that cover a number of new council areas and are responsible for large projects such as transport, infrastructure and economic development. #### Why is reorganisation happening?

The Government requires all 21 two-tier areas of local government in England to reorganise by 1 April, 2028 into one or more unitary authorities (single councils that provide all services).

Not reorganising is not an option. Our job is to recommend to the Government what should replace your current councils in the future. That's why your views are so important.

#### Aims of reorganisation

In its English Devolution White Paper and guidance to councils, the Government set out some key points it wants councils to take into account in their reorganisation proposals. A simple summary of these is below.

- A single tier of local government that relates to a sensible economic area and allows a smaller number of councils to work better together on large scale projects, like increasing housing supply and meeting local needs.
- Improve local services to make life easier and better for local people.
- · Save money and deliver better value by cutting costs.
- Make local government simpler and less confusing for residents.
- Support local identity by creating a new local government structure that makes sense to local communities and what makes them special.
- · Strengthen community engagement and empowerment.
- Larger more robust councils, but not so big they lose their local feel. The
  white paper suggests councils should aim to cover a population of at least
  500,000 people but ministers have since confirmed this is a guide and not
  a target. Some councils may be smaller and some larger than this figure.

#### Councils in Worcestershire now

Currently in Worcestershire there are two, and in some areas three, tiers or layers of councils:

- Worcestershire County Council covers the whole county and provides large strategic services like adult social care, education, children's services, road and pavement maintenance, public health, libraries and waste disposal.
- Six city, borough or district councils each provide localised services across district areas like waste and recycling collections, deciding planning applications, access to social housing, monitoring air quality, parks and leisure centres.
- Town and parish councils aren't part of the reorganisation process but may need to play a greater role in future in delivering services and representing communities.

All these councils have their own elected group of councillors who represent the views of people living in their area.

#### **Future options for Worcestershire**

In March 2025, all seven councils in Worcestershire submitted an interim plan to the Government. This set out proposals to replace the county and six borough, city and district councils with one of the two options shown below.

- One unitary council this would provide all services from collecting bins to school admissions across the geographic area currently covered by Worcestershire County Council.
- Two unitary councils this would split the county into two new councils with one for the north of the county and one for the south of the county, as shown in the map below. Each one would be responsible for all services in their part of the county.



Both options will be simpler for residents to understand, reduce staff and councillor numbers and save money compared to the current structure. Exactly how much is not currently known, so work is underway to provide detailed information around both options to help us understand the potential savings and other benefits involved.

Other parts of the country that have already reorganised their councils have chosen to create one, two or more unitary councils depending on their local circumstances. When filling in our survey, your response should be based on what you believe will be best for Worcestershire. There is no right or wrong answer.

Reorganising your councils together

Your feedback, along with other information, will be used to help work up detailed proposals on the two options to be presented to councillors in Worcestershire in autumn 2025. They will see your feedback as part of these discussions, but no other information that would allow you to be identified. Councillors will then confirm their choices before submission to the Government by 28 November 2025.

### Illegal gun found where drug dealer was selling heroin

A COUNTY lines drug dealer from Kidderminster who kept an illegal gun at an address from where he was selling crack cocaine and heroin has

been jailed for eight years. Zach Pearson, 19, formerly of Washington Street, was found guilty of possession with intent to supply a Class A drug – crack cocaine, possession with intent to supply a class A drug – heroin, possession of an illegal firearm and possession of prohibited animunition. He was jailed at Worcester Crown Court. Pearson was involved in the EMZ

Pearson was involved in the EMZ county line, later known as the MJ line, which was advertising crack cocaine and heroin for sale. County lines are telephone numbers or deal lines' used to run an organised drug-dealing network.

Police said Pearson was first arrested in the early hours of September 12 last year, at an address in Cranham Drive, Warndon, Worcester, after reports he was sus-

Worcester, after reports he was suspected of supplying class A drugs



from the property. On September 13, 2024, a police search advisor (PolSA) led search was carried out at the same address

During a search of the kitchen, a handgun was found, wrapped in a plastic bag. This was confirmed to be a viable firearm with a magazine containing live ammunition and was forensically linked to Pearson and he was later charged with the illegal weapons offences

Around a week later, on Thursday September 19, a safeguarding check was carried out at an address on Crickley Drive, Worcester, relating to a local class A drug user.

As police conducted the check,

a balaclava-wearing Pearson tried to escape through a living room window but was detained by officers a short distance away following a foot chase.

Police seized £1,470 cash from his trouser pocket and drugs para-phernalia, including a burner phone which contained text messages sent out by him offering crack cocaine and heroin for sale.

Intelligence gained led to offic-

ers executing a drugs warrant an address on Brookthorpe Close, Worcester, on October 3 last year.
Pearson was found in the toi-

let, with the light off, potentially attempting to dispose of drugs



down the toilet. He was caught wearing a black bag over his shoulder that contained crack cocaine and heroin with a street value esti-

mated around £6,000.

Pearson was later charged with the two drugs offences and two firearms offences. He was further charged with the acquisition or use of criminal property during the investigation. For that he was sentenced to a total of 12 months

sentenced to a total of 12 months to run concurrently.

Investigating officer DC Paul Modley, of South Worcestershire Proactive CID, said: "We are pleased to get this lengthy custodial sentence for Pearson who was operating ating a county line drug-dealing

"His arrest and conviction not

but also a viable firearm has been taken off the streets further protecting the public from potential danger.
"Criminals like Pearson are right-

ly pursued and brought to justice by West Mercia Police as the illegal drugs they sell heap misery and harm on the communities we are here to protect and serve.

We will not cease in our efforts to hunt his kind down, bring them before the courts and disrupt and close their county lines."

West Mercia Police have urged

people to report any signs of criminal activity in their area either via the website at westmercia.police.uk or by calling 101 or Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

### Former Harrier jailed for £600k drugs smuggling

A PROFESSIONAL footballer who played for Kidderminster Harriers last year has been jailed for trying to import \$600,000 worth of cannabis into the UK.

Jay Emmanuel Thomas, 34, who turned out nine times for Harriers and also made five appearances for Arsenal between 2008 and 2011, was sentenced to four years behind bars following a National Crime Agency (NCA) investigation.

Thomas was jailed at Chelmsford Crown Court after the smuggling incident recruiting two women to travel to Thailand. There, the cannabis was collected and

smuggled to the UK.
On September 2, 2024,
Thomas' girlfriend Yasmin
Piotrowska, 33, and her
friend Rosie Rowland, 29, were stopped by Border Force officers at Stansted Airport after landing on a

flight from Bangkok.

They had two suitcases each, which were searched, and a total of 60kg of canna-

bis - 15kg in each bag - was

recovered. Piotrowska, of Kensal Green, London, and Rowland, of Chelmsford, Essex, were charged with smuggling can-

But the Crown dropped the case against the pair who said they believed they were

transporting gold.
It is believed Thomas, who also played for Queens Park Rangers, Ipswich Town and Rayong in Thailand diary between suppliers in Thailand and drug pushers in the IIK

The investigation revealed, with Thomas' encourage-ment, the women had made a near identical trip – which was all-expenses paid and included a promise of a \$2,500 payment - a few months earlier in July.

Thomas, now of Gourock, near Glasgow, was arrested on September 18 last year after he had signed for Greenock

Morton in Scotland. On his way to custody after being arrested, he said unprompted: "I just feel sorry for the girls."

for the girls."
David Philips, NCA senior investigating officer, said: "We urge anyone asked to bring something into the UK that they're unsure of to simply say no.
"Organised criminals like

Thomas are invariably very persuasive with promises of payments and other enticements to couriers.

"But the risk of getting caught is very high and it simply isn't worth the risk."

### Support grows for Maypole bid

THE FRIENDS of the Maypole Group has submitted its bid for the much-loved land in Bewdley which it is trying to safeguard for future generations.

We reported on last week's front page that Maypole Piece in Wribbenhall was up for sale and there were fears it could be developed for hous-

ing.

The group was in a race against time to raise as much money as possible to put a bid in for the land before the

deadline.
Over the weekend, there Over the weekend, there was a flurry of activity with numerous pledges coming in and the group's available funds were at just over \$129,000 when the bid was submitted on Tuesday morning. It has since risen to \$131,000.

The Friends of the Maypole group wants to buy the land and place it in public trust ownership so it can be enjoyed by generations of people in Wribbenhall, Bewdley and the wider area for many years to come.

There is no named designated as to how long the process will take.

Committee member Denise Eaton told the Standard: "The bid has gone in now and it is a waiting game to see if we have been successful.

"We want to say a big thank you to all the community for their support in trying to secure Maypole Piece."

#### Plenty of support

A drop-in session at the Wribbenhall Parish Rooms on Saturday for the less tech savvy and those with no Internet access was also well attended.

A representative from the group gave a three-minute presentation to Bewdley Town Council at a meeting on Monday to inform councillors about its plans to buy the land for the community.

And over the weekend,

lead singer of Led Zeppelin, Robert Plant, formally sup-ported the Friends group's

campaign.

# Lengthy jail term for dealer despite attempts to delay trial

A DRUG-DEALER supplying class A drugs - namely cocaine - across Worcestershire and beyond has been jailed for 22 years and eight months.

Michael Morris, 58, of Maple Road, Rubery was found guilty in October 2023 of the offences and his drug-dealing extended throughout the county, including Kidderminster and Wychbold with some spanning from the West Midlands afar afield as Ilfracombe in Devon.

Police said Morris manipulated the

Police said Morris manipulated the court system into multiple delays to evade prosecution and parted company with several barristers, before he represented himself throughout the trial

In further efforts to evade prosecution for his involvement, he attempted to hide behind a defence suggesting in his opening address that his son was responsible.

He provided no evidence of this,

He provided no evidence of this, and the jury found him guilty - agreeing with the prosecution evidence that

RAIL FIRE: A FIRE broke out on a railway embankment in Riverway Drive, Bewdley, on Saturday. A Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service crew from Wyre Forest was called at 1.40pm. Around 100m of trackside vegetation was extinguished using backpacks and a water jet.

it was indeed Michael Morris who was making the drug supply arrangements. Morris should have appeared before the court on November 21, 2023, with others including Gareth Pegler, Sinead Lavelle and Mighele Massey - now already convicted for their part in the conspiracy. But, instead, he delayed proceedings and did not face trial until nearly two years after his arrest.

nearly two years after his arrest.

Then, in a last-ditch attempt to evade justice, he absconded and failed to attend court to hear his conviction or to be sentenced.

Just over 12 months later he was

Just over 12 months later he was recaptured and was yesterday sentenced for his part in the conspiracy and further offences relating to his disappearance.

disappearance. His Honour Judge Jonathan Salmon said in his summing up: "Within this conspiracy to supply a large and established county line into large parts of Devon, you are clearly at the top of the tree.

the tree.
"You supplied a criminal group running that substantial county lines operation. You were the wholesale supplier of cocaine to those lower down.
"I'm clear you were not operating

"I'm clear you were not operating as a broker or agent but you yourself were profiting to the full extent of this supply.

"After you went on the run you had

"After you went on the run you had sufficient resources and contacts to evade capture for 15 months.

"This was a concerted attempt to evade justice over a lengthy period.

"You are someone the text messag-

es demonstrate was part of a serious organised crime.

organised crime.
"You were able to live at large and hide and spend monies from your criminal activities."

HHJ Salmon commended West Mercia Police and the investigation team for their efforts which insured all involved were brought to face justice.

Det Insp Gareth Evans said: "I have had the fortune to work with some outstanding and diligent detectives during my career in West Mercia Police and in this case, many had moved on or retired due to the delays and time taken to proach trill."

to reach trial.
"One ex-officer returned post to
ensure his evidence was heard to support the prosecution.

"Despite the best efforts of offenders like Morris to thwart the system, rest assured West Mercia Police will pursue those guilty of offences."

those guilty of offences.

"Justice has been done and, because of the hard work and commitment of West Mercia officers, Morris has received the sanction deserved."

received the sanction deserved."

Morris will now be pursued through the Proceeds of Crime Act to recoup cash and belongings acquired through his criminal exploits.

### Chance to see revamp of listed Old Court building

VISITORS can get the chance to see The Old Court - from the inside out - following its transforma-tion earlier this year.

The open day, from 2.30pm to 5.30pm on June 26, is being held by Wyre Forest District Council's facilities team who will be on hand to provide walk-around tours of the building at

half-hourly intervals. Coun Dan Morehead, Wyre Coun Dan Morehead, Wyre Forest District Council's Cabinet Member for Economic Regeneration, Planning and the Green Agenda, said: "We know there are people who've been interested in the transformation of the building which was the

former Magistrates' Court.
"We're inviting these people to come and see what has been achieved and how the building is starting its new life.

"It now provides 1,800sq m of high-quality office and event space available to rent alongside county-wide innovation projects newly installed and already flourishing in the space.

The Old Court is a Grade II listed building designed in the Queen Anne Revival style by the architect JG Bland of Birmingham. It was



built between 1878 and 1879 for RJ Willis, a company known for making Brussels carpets.

In 1883, the premises was sold to Woodward, Grosvenor and Company and used as its main offices and showroom.

The adjacent weaving sheds appear to have been extended at this time -

according to Historic England.

In 1971 the building and weaving sheds were sold to the borough council and part of the main build-

ing was converted to become the Magistrates' Court with the remain-ing premises used as office accommodation for various council departments. The weaving sheds at the back became a covered market until the mid-1990s.

The Magistrates' Court moved to new premises in mid-2000s.

A small public landscape area opposite the southwest frontage of the main building – Coronation Gardens – was created in 1952. The open day will be held at The Old Court on June 26. Picture courtesy of Wyre Forest District Council, s

The building boasts three floors accessed by a lift which offer individual workspaces, shared kitchen, event spaces, meeting rooms, shower and toilets.
The former court chamber


itself is now a large light, bright conference and meeting room with seating capacity for 120

Thanks to the restoration project, the outside public space has also been enhanced, providing a pedestrian route through town and offering a small children's play area.
The transformation of The Old

Court has been possible, thanks to funding through the Future High Streets Fund (FHSF) - the former government's funding scheme to transform struggling high streets.







### Charity calls for police dogs to have pensions

police dogs when they retire has launched a campaign calling for pensions for all police service animals when they hang up their hadges

The Thin Blue Paw Foundation has launched a petition calling for the Government to introduce mandatory financial assistance for police dogs once they retire - or police dog pensions.

This will mean new owners are

not left to face hefty vet bills for dogs who often come with health and medical conditions due to their strenuous working lives.

The Foundation supports retired police dogs across the UK and has, since launching in August 2020, provided grants totaling more than \$380,000 for life-saving surgeries, vital medication, and regular therapy to ensure these canine heroes live long, happy and healthy retirements and receive the treatment they need for any medical conditions they suffer. There are around 1,700 serving police dogs operating across the UK's 45 police forces, and an estimated 100, on average, retire every

#### Future planning

While the Thin Blue Paw Foundation will continue to support retired police dogs across the UK the charity's trustees want to see policy change to secure the futures of these dogs and guarantee they can access the best in veterinary treatment, therapy and medication once

The charity has launched a petition and is urging the public to get behind the campaign, which would see the Government ring-fencing a budget to ensure a basic level of support to the retired dogs' new owners to ensure they are not left with the significant financial pressures themselves.

Around £5,000 of those funds have Around 25,000 of those funds have paid for Captain, who served with West Midlands Police as a general purpose dog for three years before retiring, in 2022, when he ruptured his cruciate ligament and being declared unfit for service

The strenuous working life had taken its toll on the seven-year-old's spine and the German Shepherd now needs major spinal surgery to repair the damage his physical career had

The Thin Blue Paw has already paid for diagnostic tests, scans and treatment to find the extent of the damage to his spine and veterinary experts have suggested he needs rehabilitative therapy to strengthen him before they can operate.

And the charity is paying for him

otherapy and medication, surgery is expected to cost a further

The charity's chairman, Kieran Stanbridge, said: "Unfortunately, the wear and tear from Captain's working life has left its mark on his body, and he's been struggling on his rear legs for some time. Tests have shown that he's got severe damage to his spine which needs surgery so he can

continue to have a quality of life.

"Captain gave years of his life to working as a police dog and now he deserves to have a long and happy, comfortable retirement, so we want to give him the very best chance at

Captain, who was partnered with PC Marcus Cottrell, during his career was a 'fearsome' police dog who was excellent at his job and won the Police Chief's Certificate of Achievement.

#### 'Physical demands'

Mr Stanbridge added: "Police dogs lead physically demanding lives and, when they retire - whether due to injury or age - they often have health problems as a result of their career, which can require expensive med-ication, therapy and management throughout their retirement.

'Although we've worked with insur-

ance companies over the last few years to help them launch special pol-icies open to retired police dogs making it easier for owners to get insur-ance cover, it's the Government's responsibility to offer some ongoing support to these canine heroes once they hang up their harness."

The Foundation says arthritis is

the most common condition it helps

owners treat and, based on an average of \$200-a-month for pain-relief medication, estimates it costs around \$2,400 a year more to care for a retired police dog than a normal pet dog of a similar age and breed.
