POLICE carried out speed checks on roads in

POLICE carried out speed checks on roads in Stourport and Kidderminster over the weekend and clocked 71 motorists going above the limit. Officers were out with their speed guns on Minster Road, north of Stourport, and on the A448 Bromsgrove Road in Kidderminster.

The police were responding to road safety concerns, in particular speeding, raised by residents in those local communities.

West Mercia Police said: "Speeding can have

a devastating impact on the safety of road users, increasing the risk of a collision and the severity

of the consequences.
"If prosecuted for speeding, the minimum penalty is a £100 fine and three penalty points.
"Enforcing the speed limit is a 24/7 activity for us so don't risk it."

Heat is on Steven to complete massive Sahara fundraiser

Man loses 17 stone for Acorns challenge inspired by niece

A KIDDERMINSTER man is set to trek across the world's hottest desert to raise funds for Children's Acorn's Hospice.

Steven Duffield, who moved to the town three years ago, has shed more than 17st in less than a year ahead of what promises to be a gruel-ling 1,880-mile trek for his chosen cause. He has set himself a fundraising target of \$4,000 which he

hopes to surpass.
The inspiration behind his epic journey is his beloved 11-year-old niece, Meggie, who relies on the critical support of Acorns for the Three Counties for rehabilitative respite care and family services

Complex

She has a highly com-plex, rare and life limiting chromosome disorder known as Trisomy 9 mosaic syndrome. She requires permanent care, is non-verbal, unable to take solid food, has a compromised immune system and was born with sev-eral of her major organs twisted, fused and in the wrong place.

Steven, who was almost 30st in weight, made the decision to change his life two years ago and com-mitted to improving his health.

health.

He said: "When I started walking, it was just six miles in the first month – and that was more than enough for me at the

a day. As the weight fell off, my mental health improved drastically too. I slowly began to feel like

myself again.

"My dad, who we lost to dementia five years ago, was always fond of walking so walking makes me feel close to him too in many ways, and to appreciate life."

Steven is channeling his passion for walking and the great outdoors to give back.

Following a trip to Tunisia, where he first experienced the beauty of the Sahara Desert, Steven eagerly embraced the idea of trekking the Sahara. Steven said: "A friend of mine thought I was actu-

walking all the way from Kidderminster to the

"We had a good laugh when I explained the mix-up, but the idea stuck with me - I couldn't shake how incredible that challenge would be.

would be.
"Now, here I am. Whilst
I'm not physically walking to the Sahara, I'm
covering the exact same
distance, and hoping to
raise even more money
for Acorns because of it."
In a full circle moment

for Steven, he's covering this distance of 1,880 miles along the same local canals, nature reserves and trails where he first embarked on his remarkable weight loss journey, transforming both his physical health and men-

tal wellbeing. Steven added: "Acorns has been a lifeline for my

sister and her family. It's about more than just Meggie - they care for the whole family, including her twin brother, through sibling groups and family fun days."

He added when Meggie stays overnight she gets to enjoy herself and her mum and dad can get muchneeded rest knowing she is in expert

Since February, Steven has been walking up six hours every day, carrying a 30lb backpack, aiming to cover all 1,880 miles before the Sahara trek in October - that equates to more than 72 marathons and over 4.2 million steps

Raising awreness

Steven is also explaining his challenge and raising awareness of the hospice's work through his very own business cards, complete with a QR code linking to his fundraising

page.
And he is reaching out to local

businesses and planning a summer music festival to boost his funds. He added: "I'm doing everything I can because I understand firsthand

what families like mine go through. "Living with Meggie, I see every day how poorly she is and the reality of having a child with a life-limiting condition.
"I've watched her go in and out of

hospital, never knowing one day to the next if she would make it." He added: "Whenever I'm out walking and my feet start to ache or

the rain's pouring down, I just think about Meggie and other children at Acorns.
"It's a powerful reminder that any

discomfort I feel is nothing com-pared to what they go through."

SVR hope to start bridge repairs soon

THE SEVERN Valley Railway can now move ahead with repairs after the landslip at Mor Brook bridge in late January.

The heritage line's insurers have decided to settle its claim in respect of the incident.

The insurers have agreed to pay for the full reinstatement of the bridge's wing wall and stone arch as well as the embankment itself. The railway says the final costs will be significantly more than \$500,000.

raining and the man \$500,000. The SVR's managing director, Jonathan 'Gus' Dunster said he was delighted by the insurers' decision which meant they could now get on with the repairs.

"Nevertheless, the SVR is still going to be responsible for funding a substantial excess as part of the settlement

"We are still in negotiation with the insurers about the exact

amount, but thanks to the generous donations supporters have made to the SVR Resilience Fund and the SVR Charitable Trust since the landslip, we are confident we will be able to cover this.

"What's important here is that our insurance company's acceptance of the claim means we will not have to launch a full-scale appeal for the landslip repairs, which would have meant further delays before we could put things right."

SVR has appointed civil engi-

SVR has appointed civil engineering contractors CML to carry out all the works required at Mor Brook to reinstate the line. The railway's infrastructure management and permanent way teams will work with CML to provide logistical support and carry out track work.



SVR head of infrastructure Chris Bond said CML must carry out essential and detailed civil engineering design work and in the next three to four weeks, the SVR's permanent way team would remove track in preparation for works to commence

commence. "Subject to statutory approvals from the Environment Agency and National Grid, we hope to start the main contract works within six to eight weeks," he added.

"Timescales are still subject to the production of a final programme

of works, and we will provide an update on this in due course."

Mr Bond added it was currently impossible to pin down a finish date as there were many variables.

But he said it was unlikely to be completed before the middle of the summer and could be even later.

Mr Dunster paid tribute to both Antony Bartlam, the consultant civil and structural engineer and SVR volunteer, and Mr Bond for the dedication and hard work they had already put in to get the scheme to this important stage.

And he thanked everyone who had donated, including the Bahamas Locomotive Society which was donating a day's steaming fee when the loco 45596 comes to the Spring Steam Gala later this month.

"We are humbled at the level of support that we've received," said Mr Dunster.

FORMER Miss Kidderminster and owner of a pamper party salon has written a series of children's books, inspired

by her two dogs.

Jeanne Frith, who runs Pink
Lemonade and also works

Hartlebury, first had an ambition to write a children's book when she was 13 years old.

Whilst walking around Springfield Park, she came up with a short story and wrote

Jeanne said: "When I got home I said to my children, I'd written a book and when I read it to them, they didn't believe I had written it.

"The next day on my dog walk I wrote another one.

"The same thing happened and eventually I had written 10



short rhyming stories.

"For the next few months, every time I saw my son Carter, he was asking me what I was going to do with my books, asking if I had found an illustrator and 'would I get my books published?'."

Jeanne, who won Miss Kidderminster in 1986, has lived in the town for 50 years and has lots of clients here, needed an illustrator for some pictures to go with her words.

Her sister Helen Mikolajczyk

suggested she contact Nicola Christopher, a local teacher at Heronswood School and a

talented artist. Jeanne, who then commissioned Nicola to provide the illustrations, said: "She is an amazing artist - in fact, I don't think she realises how good

think she realises now good she is.

"I give her a story and she produces such detailed pictures and it's just how I imagined them to be - it's like she's in my head.'

As well as telling the tales of Harley and Pepi's escapades, each book also contains a lesson for the young readers to learn.

Jeanne has 10 books in the series and two have been pubished so far, via Amazon -'Harley, Pepi and the Treasure Map' and 'Harley, Pepi and a Christmas Tale'.

Man jailed for attacking police

A MAN who climbed derelict building in Kidderminster before throwing items off it and eventually assault-ing police officers has been sentenced to 26

weeks in prison.
Stephen Collett, 40, of no fixed abode, was arrested after climbing the scaffolding around Derwent House at Second 2000 or Merch 200

around 3am on March 29. Collett had been throwing numerous items including windows and metal off

the scaffold from the tenth

He was also seen to be endangering the public and police officers.

He had armed himself with a retractable knife he stole from the building - which is due to be demolished – further causing concerns for his welfare.

Stand-off

After a stand-off for several hours which including with negotiators, the fire and ambulance services, he was persuaded to come down and was arrested. He later assaulted two police officers.
At Kidderminster

Magistrates Court, Collett was convicted of multiple offences after pleading guilty to each count.

He was sentenced to 26

weeks imprisonment and was ordered to pay \$50 compensation to each of the officers he assaulted.

Convicted

Collett was convicted of using threatening behaviour to provoke unlawful violence. burglary other than dwelling, possession of a blade, crimidamage, harassment breach of a restraining order and two counts of assault of an emergency worker.

Former fire station blaze 'was arson'

A BLAZE broke out at the former Kidderminster Fire Station last Thursday evening and West Mercia Police believe the

fire was started deliberately.

Two Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service crews - one from Kidderminster and one from Bromsgrove were sent to the scene at 6.16pm.

The blaze was in the appliance bay of the former fire station in Castle Road.

Firefighters used water jets to extinguish the fire and crews carried out a full search of the building without finding any further fires or casualties.

Positive pressure ventilation was used to clear smoke from the building.
The premises were boarded up and the alarm silenced and re-set.

West Mercia Police also attended the incident.

A police spokesperson said a pile of wood was set alight and spread to the building.
"The fire is being treated as arson and

enquiries are ongoing."

Sharing Kitty's Holocaust story

STUDENTS at The Stourport High School and Sixth Form College were gripped by the telling of one woman's Holocaust testimony.

Second generation Holocaust experts Peter and Moira Hart spoke to more than 130 history and philosophy students from years nine, 12 and 13 about the Second World War atrocity.

Their talk was based on the life of Peter's mother, Kitty Hart-Moxon, who survived the Nazi concentration camps and later helped establish the Holocaust Educational Trust.

Now, aged 98, the task of ensuring new generations never forget and learn that it must never happen again has

must never nappen again has fallen to Peter and his wife. History teacher Ben Riley said: "The students listened intently to the harrowing account of Kitty's experience from 1939 to 1945 and how she went on to live her life.

"As well as horrific it was also inspirational and they were full of questions for Peter and Moira to further their understanding. We are very grateful to them for tak ing the time to come and talk

her mother survived being her mother survived being taken prisoner by the Nazis, which included time at Auschwitz, but her father, older brother and grand-mother were killed. After the war she and her mother came to live in Pirmingham with her can't

Birmingham with her aunt who had escaped to England in 1938 and Kitty became a radiographer.

She has written two autobi-ographies, featured in two TV documentaries and in 2003 received the OBE for her work in Holocaust education

The talk followed a visit to Auschwitz by four sixth form students, in conjunction with Holocaust Educational Trust, in February

Sixth former Saffy Watters said: "After visiting Auschwitz as part of the lessons from Auschwitz series, I think we must recognise our shared responsibility in rejecting complacency in the face of discrimination, ensuring that 'Never Again' is not an empty refrain but a guiding princi-ple for the future."

Time to have say on wards

RESIDENTS just have a few days left to have their say on boundary changes to town council wards in Stourport and Kidderminster. The alterations are due to take

effect at their next elections (May 2027 and 2028 respectively).

It follows a Local Government Boundary Commission review of electoral arrangements for Worcestershire County Council.

Both town councils have asked Wyre Forest District Council to conduct a community govern-ance review on these new warding arrangements.

The reviews will examine continuing to use the wards in the two towns that existed prior to the Boundary Commission's review.

New boundaries

It was in October when Stourporton-Severn Town Council resolved to 'request Wyre Forest District Council to carry out a Community Governance Review to re-establish its ward boundaries

In the case of Kidderminster, that would involve using the same ward boundaries as those used by the district council.

Also in October, Kidderminster

Town Council resolved the follow-

For the Kidderminster Foreign Review - To support the propos-al that the Kidderminster Town Council boundary should include the Habberley Road development which should be transferred to the town.

town.

For Wolverley and Cookley - To call for redrawing of the boundary between Kidderminster and Wolverley and Cookley in two areas - 1. At Sion Hill, by bringing the site of the former school ing the site of the former school site into Kidderminster (Wildmoor Road) and 2. To also bring the development on Stourbridge Road (Albrighton Drive and Bowdler Close) into Kidderminster.

The council also resolved to call on Wyre Forest District Council to carry out a community govern-ance review to re-establish common ward boundaries with those used for WFDC in Kidderminster and to make other changes to Kidderminster's boundary so that it includes Kittiwake Drive, the whole of the Woven Oaks development and the developed areas comprising Finepoint Way and Zortech Avenue.

Kidderminster man was among gang jailed for almost 100 years

A GANG of drug dealers who flooded Worcestershire with cocaine and cannabis have been sentenced to a total of 94 years and four months,

Paul Bailey, 56 of Jersey Close, Redditch, was sentenced to 20 years at Worcester Crown Court last Monday Monday after being convicted of conspiracy to supply 10kg of cocaine and 20kg of cannabis.

His sentence is the final one in a complex and lengthy investigation by the Regional Organised Crime Unit for the West Midlands Region (ROCUWM) called Operation Pyrogenic which has seen other gang members sentenced at earlier court appearances

The other five involved were also convicted in November of conspiracy to supply 10kg of and cocaine and

20kg of cannabis.

Jamie Worrall, 38, of Sandicliffe
Close, Kidderminster, was sentenced
to 17 years, Arron Adams, 39, of Boughton Avenue, Worcester, was sentenced to 22 years and Adam Nicholls, 42, of Weyburn Close, Worcester was sentenced to 23

Nicola Everton, 37, of Hindlip, Worcester, was sentenced to six years and Phillip Smith, 57, of Gregorys Bank, Worcester, was sentenced to six years four months.

Another accomplice - Shaun Carr, 39, of Woodmancote, Worcester was given a 10-month sentence, sus-











pended for 12 months, after being found guilty of money laundering on November 6.

Large scale drug-dealing

Operation Pyrogenic was ROCUWM operation into the large-scale supply of cocaine and cannabis into Worcestershire, Herefordshire and the West Midlands.

The operation - between April 2020 and July 2021 - revealed the gang operated a large-scale middle market

drugs supply chain and were involved in the sourcing, distribution and sell-ing drugs which reached as far as Lincolnshire and Devon.

This organised crime group used

encrypted mobile phone devices on a platform based in France called 'Encro-chat' to organise the supply of cannabis and cocaine which were infiltrated and deciphered by the

National Crime Agency (NCA).

Bailey, Adams, Nicholls, Worrall,
Everton, and Smith used the devices to orchestrate the multi-kilo supply of cannabis and cocaine into the region. They continued to operate after the Encro-chat network had been infiltrated by police using other encrypted communication applications.
On July 9, 2020, Everton was

arrested by police with a kilogram of cocaine in her vehicle on the M5 near

junction 6 (Worcester).
On January 6, 2021, police arrested Bailey, Adams, Nicholls and Smith at their home addresses

During searches of the addresses imagery was found to assist in the attribution of the Encro-chat handles. Nicholls sent an image of his computer with his reflection on it over the Encro-chat under one of the user

On October 27, 2020, Carr was arrested by officers at junction 2 on the M5 with £17,000 in a plastic shopping bag.

Fingerprints found

They found one of Nicholls' fingerprints on this bag. Police seized numerous mobile phones after the conspirators had been arrested.

On Smith's mobile phone, police found evidence of drug supply and conversations between him and other conspirators about the movement of

Carr, Smith, Bailey, Everton and Worral all pleaded guilty prior to trial. After a three-week trial at Worcester Crown Court a jury took less than six hours of deliberation to find Adams

and Nicholls guilty of the conspiracy on November 6.

'Strong message'

Det Ch Insp Peter Cooke, from ROCUWM, said it was a fantastic result after a complex investigation. "The team have successfully taken a

large number of drugs off the streets and put this group who caused misery in our communities behind bars for a

very long time.

"Drugs ruin lives and poison communities and we remain dedicated to breaking supply lines through our

region.
"These offenders are ruthless and think nothing of exploiting vulnerable people, putting them at risk of serious harm, while they sit back and count the money.

"These sentences send a strong message that drug dealers will be caught, and they face many years in prison.
"We will continue to strive to keep

drugs off our streets and protect vul-

nerable people."

This investigation forms part of Operation Target – West Mercia Police's work to tackle serious and organised crime.



Beware thieves at ATMs, warn police

POLICE officers in north Worcestershire are signposting the way to the public to protect themselves from distraction thefts at cash machines.

Warning posters are being displayed around the machines in Kidderminster town centre this week and will be rolled out in Redditch and Bromsgrove in due course.

The message tells members of the public to be cautious when using cash machines as thieves who may be operating in the area will try to distract them.

The proactive campaign follows reports of people being targeted while at the machines by tricksters, normally working in pairs, divert-

ing the victims' attention.

For example, the con artists may point to a bank note on the floor and ask the person if they have dropped it and meanwhile an accomplice will attempt to withdraw cash from the machine while their card is still in it or take the card itself.

They may also attempt to

get close to the person at the cash machine and ask questions, distracting them and allowing another offender to access the machine.

Sarah Sceats, Rural and Business Officers (RABO) for north Worcestershire, came up with the idea of the posters and is working with banks to roll them out across the area.

Ms Screats said: "While thankfully there have only been a handful of these types of distraction thefts in this area, this tactic is becoming more prevalent nationally.

more prevalent nationally.

"We are acting now to help protect members of the

public from being tricked out of their money at cash machines.

"Working in partnership with local banks, we have designed and printed the new posters to stick next to machines warning people to be cautious whilst using them.

"Our advice is to be mindful of anyone nearby who seems suspicious or who may be trying to distract you and take extra care when at the cash machine."

Firefighters issue warning after tackling several fires on open land

A PROLONGED dry spell has led to a rise in the number of outdoor blazes getting out of control across north Worcestershire and a warning from Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service.

There has been very little rain in the past week-and-a-half and temperatures on some days have been upward of 20°C.

At the end of last week, over the weekend and during this week, fire crews have been called to several incidents in Bromsgrove, Rubery, Redditch and Kidderminster.

Also on Monday, a crew from Wyre Forest Fire Station was called at 11.53am to an embankment fire on the Severn Valley Railway at Devils Spittleful. Two seats of fire were located and were extinguished using beaters and water backpacks.

Last Friday there was a fire at Burlish Top Nature Reserve in Stourport which started when youths lit a bonfire and it spread. Firefighters used water backpacks and buckets of water to extinguish the blaze there.

A Wyre Forest Fire Station crew was also called around 1.30pm on Sunday to a fire in the open in Borrington Road, Offmore, Kidderminster. The fire involved 10m by 10m of undergrowth and trees which had spread to plastic

underground culverts. The fire was extinguished by the firefighters using a water

It is believed that one was started deliberately as two youths were seen fleeing the scene.



County named burglary hotspot

WEST Mercia Police has recorded more than 1,800 home burglaries in the last year alone, with just five per cent resulting in a charge, a new investigation has revealed.

Data obtained by Legal Expert via Freedom of Information Requests has found that 7,875 residential break-ins have been recorded by West Mercia Police in the last three years.

Of the 1,812 burglaries logged last year, just 99 (five per cent) resulted in a person being charged.

While there will be cases still be under investigation, Legal Expert's CICA (Criminal Injury Compensation Authority) specialist, Ellie Lamey said charge rates were 'shockingly low'

Authorny) specialist, Ellie Lamey said charge rates were 'shockingly low.' "Being the victim of a burglary can be extremely invasive and traumatic not to mention those instances of aggravated burglary where weapons are involved.

weapons are involved.

"Moreover the shockingly low charge rate gives victims



the impression that there is no support or justice following what can be in some cases, a life-altering event."

West Mercia Police also revealed the region's home burglary hotspots in 2024. North Worcestershire was revealed as the most targeted area for the crime with 552 offences recorded last year.

A total of 440 residential break-ins were also logged in South Worcestershire and a further 351 in Shropshire.

Out of the 32 UK police forces, (73 per cent) which responded to Legal Expert's Freedom of Information request within the deadline, West Mercia reported the ninth-highest number of

home burglaries over the last three years. In 2024, there were

In 2024, there were 177,687 home burglaries reported across England and Wales - an average of 487 burglaries a day. Ms Lamey said:

Ms Lamey said: "Throughout my legal career, I have worked with victims and families of burglaries and the impact can be long-lasting.

"Thankfully, I've been able to bring even a small comfort by securing them the compensation they deserve to help to start to rebuild their lives."

Around 100 journalists from across the UK attended the event, including Tristan Harris, the head of editorial at Bullivant Media Group Ltd and the editor of the Kidderminster Standard and the Bromsgrove, Droitwich and Redditch Standards.

After a welcome, Sir Keir spoke

about the journalists he had met whilst on the campaign trail across

"There's a sort of mixed feeling because I've always felt that - and I say this to Cabinet members you may think answering questions in Parliament is the most difficult thing you're going to have to do, just wait until you get in front of regional media because somehow you always ask us the question that we've been secretly hoping was the one that wouldn't get asked. "But there is a really serious

point that underpins this because nobody knows your local areas and issues in the way that you do and I don't think there's any other sort of media outlets, interrogators, interviewers who can put the questions in the way that you do because you understand what's happening on your patch the way nobody else

"And in a sense, I think because you're able to translate it into what matters where you are, it makes it more meaningful."

He added it was important for politicians to understand what mattered to local communities.

"There's no one more committed to shining the torch on those

He also praised the local media for running campaigns on issues, such as knife crime, which, he said, had always been an important part of the job.

Sir Keir also said of local media:

"It's such a force for good, and I think respected by millions and I strongly feel people go to their local regional media as a trusted source in a way that they don't quite believe they can get to a trusted source elsewhere."

He added he and his colleagues always tried to reserve space for local and regional media when out and about.

He said the reach of local regional media going up was 'a good news story' but added he understood the pressure and the challenges coming up at the same time was huge.

"Keep advocating for your regions, because, obviously here in Downing Street is where we have a laser focus of communities that re advocating delivering on you're their priorities, and you must hold us to account for that."

thanked the local media for all it did and added: "Thank you for all of the work that you do holding us to account.

"But as uncomfortable though it is it is really impor-tant and it's really important we're open about that because particularly at the moment, we have to remind ourselves what living in democracy really is, where politicians can't just

really is, where politicians can't just say things and get away with it. "They've got to say things, and then they've got to face questions of what they've said and particu-larly when it's put in the context of local communities, local areas and local regions

Tristan said: "It was heartening to hear from the Prime Minister about the value he places on local media

and papers and websites like ours.

"And it was great to get the recognition for what we do - my team works extremely hard and these are tough times for our industry - but it is in everyone's interests to have a strong local press which supports and champions its local communities whilst also holding those in power to account.
